Profile overview



About

Istanbul is a city that attracts attention due to its location even when viewed from a satellite, where 4 seasons can be experienced, is a frequent destination for people from all over the world with its historical and cultural texture, as well as being the largest metropolis of Europe with unique natural beauties. Due to its location, Istanbul has a critical importance not only for humans but also for wildlife. In addition to many drinking water basins, Istanbul also includes the Terkos Basin, which was selected as one of the 100 hot spots in Europe that should be protected in terms of biodiversity within the scope of the "Gift to the World Project" carried out in cooperation with WWF. Istanbul, which acts as a bridge between the European and Asian Continents, is an important migration route for migratory birds, as well as being home to many exotic bird species and endemic plant species with its urban forests, groves and city parks. Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality, Parks and Recreation Department has started to work intensively with universities in recent years to increase the amount of green space per capita and to protect the wildlife and biodiversity in Istanbul. Our department, listening to the calls of academics, created natural flora and fauna protection zones, set up bee houses to increase biodiversity, created wildlife observation points to raise awareness and organized activities to raise environmental awareness. In addition, some of the green areas in our administration have been awarded the Green Flag awards, which is a non-profit international accreditation program that recognizes the best parks in the world. At the C40 summit of the big cities climate leadership group, the "Deadline 2020" Commitment was signed by our Metropolitan Mayor, Mr. Ekrem İmamoğlu, and the target of Istanbul's being a "carbon neutral" and "resilient city" for 2050 was accepted. In line with the objectives of the IMM Parks and Recreation Department, it is aimed to make existing public buildings powered by 100% renewable energy. In this direction, it was first implemented in the "İSMEK Pastacılık ve Fırıncılık Okulu" building. Projects design processes continue for more renewable energy. Sports and recreation areas are designed from recyclable materials within the scope of the sustainability principle, which is an important step in reducing the carbon footprint as well as protecting the raw material and reducing waste generation. Urban equipment is also produced from reuseable and recyclable materials.
